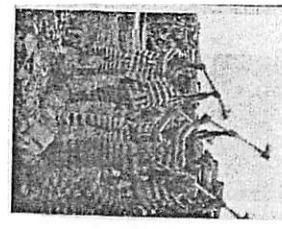

- Fighting began

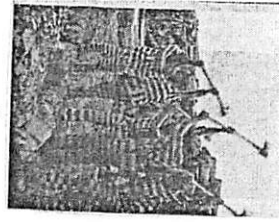
- To get votes and give the blacks their place in the state legislature back

- (Camilla, GA (Mitchell County))

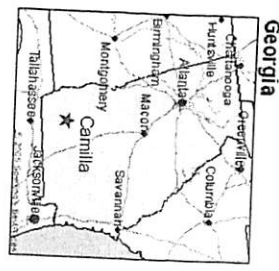
- March in with a bandwagon

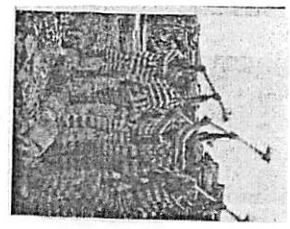

To find new ways of boosting the South's economy 	<p>All over the South</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> introducing a system of free labor creating over 3000 schools for newly freed people settling conflict over contracts between whites (landowners) and newly freed blacks failed to achieve goal in education 	<p>Created 1865 Stopped: 1872</p>

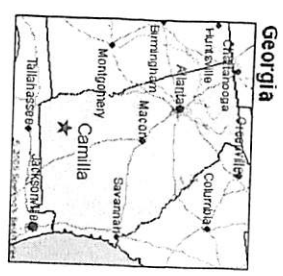

<p>Henry McNeal Turner</p> 					
<p>Junis Campbell</p> 	<p>- POLITICIAN - son of free blacks - founded NA, anticolonization society - married had 3 kids - active in anti-racism movement - aimed to help poor class hotel employees were "well educated, competent, prompt, clean and not bakers". - bought land = \$ - arrested - seat taken - lawsuits - black militia to protect him</p>	<p>- felt strongly about equal rights especially voting rights - lived in constant fear</p>	<p>⁹⁻²⁵ - New Jersey - worked in NY + Boston - position in GA - traveled to DC. - family in Medin GA</p>	<p>- pushed for social equality, laws of equal education, integrated jury boxes, by hiring and educating blacks, and using his political power to help create rights</p>	<p>- 1812-1891</p>
