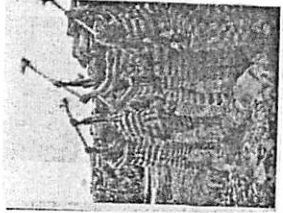

• was raised and went to D.C and wrote a book




• Most influential African American politician in the 19th century Georgia
 • preached against slavery and established schools
 • worked as hotel steward
 • Vice president of the Republican Party in GA
 • protected people from white abuses and pushed for equal education
 • Justice of the Peace
 • attacked by the KKK
 • went to jail after legislative act taken

• Upon graduation he joined the Methodist church and threw himself into evangelical uplift.
 • 1832 - he founded an anticolonization society and pledged "never to leave this country until the every slave was free on American soil"

 Washington

• actively participated in the colored convention movement and often shared the stage with Frederick Douglass
 • wrote a book on suffering
 • he organized a black power structure that protected
 • he headed a so-called strong African American militia

• Born April 1, 1812 • Dec 21, 1891
 • 1848 - his hotel burned
 • 1851
 • 1857 - murder
 • 1876 - convicted death

Ashburn was the first murder victim of the KKK in Georgia.</p>	<p>Temperance Hall Columbus, GA</p>	<p>Pro-African-American sentiments.</p>	<p>Murdered by the Klan in the corner of 13th & 1st street by a group of 5 well-dressed men wearing masks.</p> <p>March 30, 1868</p>

<p> Henry McNeal Turner</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • bishop of AME, ordained 1st woman • state legislator • Active politician • often threatened by Radical Whites • involved in first black regiment • army chaplain • KKK threaten him • postmaster of Macon • promoted emigration 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wanted to better the community • Very holy • Believed in equal rights 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Atlanta • Washington • St. Louis • South Carolina • Macon • Savannah • Africa • Canada 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Promoting it through the church • Promoting emigration to Africa • Scared of KKK 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Born 1834 • Died 1915 • 1867 came involved w/ politics • 1870 regained seat in legislature
